A - Operations Reports

1. Appointment of Ngāpuhi Asset Holding Company Ltd (NAHC) Director

Ngāpuhi Asset Holding Company (NAHC) CEO Paul Knight provided <u>a report and</u> recommendation to appoint an additional director to the NAHC Board.

The Trustees resolved to appoint <u>Nick Wells</u> as director of Ngāpuhi Assets Holding Company.

2. Housing of He Whakaputanga me Te Tiriti o Waitangi - Presentation from Hinerangi Himiona

5. Rangitāne

Far North Holding Company (FNHC) acting as agent and applicant on behalf of Far North District Council (FNDC) applied to the Environment Protection Agency (EPA) for a fast track consent to develop a new boat ramp facility within the Kerikeri inlet, in an area known as Rangitane.

Dallas King was commissioned by the Rūnanga to write and file with the EPA a Cultural Impact Report (CIA). In receiving the report, the Trustees thanked Dallas for a very well written and comprehensive report. <u>Click on this link</u> to see the full CIA.

13. Te Kahu o Taonui

A summary report of activities was received from Te Kahu o Taonui (TKoT). The Trustees asked the Chief Executive to thank TKoT Operations Manager for the information and to seek from them their annual work plan so the Rūnanga may more clearly understand the matters that are before TKoT.

The Trustees wish to receive fuller and more timely information from Te Kahu o Taonui on matters such as those being dealt with by the Te Kōtui Hauora Board.

With regard to Te Kōtui Hauora and, in particular, the development of the Draft Transition Plan for the Māori Partnership Board, the Chief Executive is asked to seek further information on the plan development process and to forward a request that TKoT include the Rūnanga Chairperson on the Kōtui Hauora board. Concern was expressed that the development of the draft appears to have progressed without the informed support of Ngāpuhi.

14. Ngāpuhi Assets Holding Company Ltd (NAHC) - Operations Report

NAHC CEO Paul Knight provided a report, which was received by the Trustees.

Highlights include:

- For the first six months of the financial year to December, NAHC is trading favorably to budget.
- Despite volatile market conditions, the funds invested with MINT Asset Management performed well.
- A dividend was received from Aotearoa Fisheries Ltd (trading as Moana NZ) in December which was bolstered by higher than anticipated recognition of revenue from Sealord's Australian operations.
- NSSL (Mobil Kaikohe) is projected to contribute, despite significant trading disruptions through Covid restrictions.
- A full group insurance tender and renewal process has been completed.
- The sale/transfer of the Kaikohe hotel site to the rūnanga has been completed.
- NAHC is providing continued assistance within the Bay of Islands Marine Protected Areas court proceedings.

15. Reports from Te Hau Ora Ō Ngāpuhi (THOON) and Ngāpuhi lwi Social Services (NISS)
