



2023 Ngāpuhi Education Scholarship Information Sheet

Introduction

Te Rūnanga-Ā-Iwi O Ngāpuhi ('the Rūnanga') introduced and established the Ngāpuhi Education Scholarships in 2003. The overall aim of the Ngāpuhi Education Scholarships is to assist students registered on the Ngāpuhi Iwi Register to:

- Fulfil their potential for academic success;
- Encourage applicants to contribute their knowledge and skills towards the wellbeing and development of Ngāpuhi whanau, hapū and iwi.

Scholarships Available

The following 2023 Scholarships are now available for approved studies at the following levels:

1. University Entrance/NCEA Award
 - 16 x \$500 Disbursements
2. Bachelor/Undergraduate Degree
 - 45 x \$1,000 Bachelor Degree level disbursements
3. Graduate and Post-Graduate Scholarships
 - 7 x \$1,500 Honours Degree
 - 7 x \$1,500 Graduate or Post-Graduate Diploma
 - 5 x \$2,000 Masters
 - 4 x \$4,000 PhD

IMPORTANT INFORMATION – Please read carefully before submitting your application

Eligibility

To be eligible for a scholarship, applicants must:

- Whakapapa to Ngāpuhi and be fully registered with the Rūnanga;
- Be formally enrolled with a tertiary provider as a full-time Undergraduate or part-time Graduate or Post-Graduate;
- Be studying in New Zealand;
- Complete a *2023 Ngāpuhi Education Scholarship Application Form* and provide all information requested by the closing date. Incomplete application forms will not be accepted.
- All sections of the application form must be completed.
- You are not eligible to apply if you have been the recipient of a scholarship in the previous academic year.

Supporting Documents

To support your application, please provide a COPY only of the following documentation, as no part of your application will be returned.

- Proof of course enrolment (year of scholarship application);
- Academic transcripts of previous study.

Closing Date

Applications must be 'received' by the Rūnanga no later than 5.00pm on Friday 31st March 2023.

Course of Study

New Zealand courses of study must be NZQA accredited or equivalently approved.

Withdrawal from Study

If for some reason, you withdraw from your course prior to receiving funding, you MUST notify the Rūnanga immediately. Failure to do so may result in future applications being declined.

Successful Applicants

All applicants will be notified in writing by 1st May 2023.

- Funds will be paid by direct credit to your nominated bank account before 1st May 2023.

Please be advised that if successful, you will not be eligible for another scholarship the year following receipt of disbursement.

Unsuccessful Applicants

All applicants will be notified in writing by 1st May 2023.

- You may reapply in the following academic year.
